SELÇUK GÜÇERİ, Ph.D.

Selçuk Güçeri, Ph.D, currently serves as Dean of Engineering at Drexel University. He is known for his research activities in the development of innovative technologies for fabrication of high-performance composite materials. He has been instrumental in the establishment and growth of a number of research programs, first at the University of Delaware, and subsequently at the University of Illinois at Chicago, before coming to Drexel.

Dr. Güçeri's commitment to educational outreach, especially in K-12 institutions, is noteworthy. In his time at Drexel, the College of Engineering's outreach program has included over one thousand teachers and 30,000 students. This includes several activities which partner teachers with faculty and graduate students in hands-on learning exercises and enables the teachers to develop lesson plans that draw on engineering and science.

Under Dr. Güçeri's guidance, Drexel has become a major sponsor of the FIRST Robotics program. This nationally-recognized competition is one of the most successful initiatives for the attraction of middle school and high school students to engineering and it is particularly effective in the encouragement of young women and minority students to the pursuit of careers in technology. Similarly, the SeaPerch project, which mimics FIRST but focuses on underwater robotics, has been embraced by Drexel with assistance from the Navy. Dr. Güçeri believes the development of talent that will pursue science and engineering studies and careers is paramount to the maintenance of the vitality of the Delaware Valley region for both industry and academia.

Dr. Güçeri is an active member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME). He received his Bachelors and Masters degrees from the Middle Eastern Technical University and his Doctorate from North Carolina State University.
